Introduction

Since the Mayyun Organization for Human Rights' establishment in August 2021, it has been striving to ensure the preservation of children's rights and advocating against their conscription and enlistment in armed conflicts, which rank among the most horrific and detrimental crimes against future generations.

The Mayyun organization is committed to prioritizing victims and vulnerable groups in need of care and protection, as per international humanitarian laws in armed conflicts, which mandate all parties protect women, displaced persons, refugees, and children.

By issuing the «Child Warriors» report as part of a series of human rights reports on child recruitment in Yemen, the Mayyun Organization aims to pivotally advocate against child conscription, uncover violations, hold perpetrators accountable, and achieve justice for victims.

The Mayyun Organization was eager to establish a capable and experienced work team whose methodology adheres to international monitoring and documentation standards. It maintains its commitment to exposing egregious abuses perpetrated by conflict parties and our confidence in working with the international community to put an immediate end to the recruitment and use of children as soldiers.

In the next phase, the organization seeks to launch an international and local campaign to protect children and to prioritize the issue of child conscription and recruitment in Yemen's political settlement files.

Executive Summary

Mayyun's initial report was part of its efforts to address human rights violations, particularly child rights violations in armed conflict. The report, published in mid-2021, garnered acclaim from human rights organizations.

In its new "Child Warriors" report, Mayyun shares with the international community the findings of its monitoring efforts of grave violations, including child recruitment and murder committed by all parties to Yemen's current armed conflict.

Dedicated to defending victims' rights and exposing violators while abiding by international monitoring and documentation standards, the organization has identified, from July 1, 2021, to December 31, 2022, a total of 2233 child soldiers directly used in the armed conflict by all parties in 18 Yemeni governorates.

The report concludes that 2,209 children have been verifiably recruited by the Houthi group/Ansar Allah on the front lines, representing 98.9% of the total incidents covered in this report. Meanwhile, the internationally recognized Yemeni government and its affiliated armed formation recruited and involved 24 children in armed actions, representing 1.1% of total incidents.

According to monitoring data, 1,309 children, including a Somali child, were killed in Houthi ranks, and 351 children were injured and maimed during frontline action. The report also

documents the deaths of 556 children in Houthi ranks. These children had been granted military ranks varying between officers and non-commissioned officers, with 753 other children given the status of soldiers in official Houthi lists.

The organization gathers that the Houthi group/Ansar Allah lured children into its troops by assigning them unwarranted ranks as a form of encouragement, with 6 children ranking as colonel, 25 ranking as lieutenant colonel, 6 ranking as major, 79 ranking as captain, 149 ranking as second lieutenant, 166 ranking as first lieutenant, and 821 ranking as soldier, non-commissioned officer, or assistant.

The internationally recognized Yemeni government's military and allied armed formations recruited a total of 24 children, 18 of whom were confirmed to be military commanders' children, with their duty confined to escorting those officials, while 6 were active in frontlines and checkpoints.

Monitoring results show that the top ten governorates with the highest numbers of children recruited into Houthi ranks are Sana'a Governorate, Hajjah, Dhamar, Saada, Amanat Al-Asimah, Amran, Ibb, Hodeidah, Taiz, and Al-Mahwit. Data also shows that children between the ages of sixteen and seventeen are most exposed to violations of recruitment and use as soldiers by the Houthi group.

While the organization monitored a decrease in the number of child victims recruited by the Houthi group during the

UN armistice that began in April 2022 and was twice extended, the group's mobilization and polarization campaigns were ongoing during that period.

The organization also received reports of the recruitment of 25 children belonging to families of African immigrants and was able to verify four of them.

Interviews with families of victims and testimonies by educational and social leaders indicated that, due to a lack of fighters, the Houthi group has resorted to recruiting large numbers of fighters regardless of their age.

Exploiting the living and economic circumstances of children and their families is one of the main ways the Houthi group recruits children for armed conflict. This strategy is followed by ideological indoctrination and incitement through public and private media outlets and social networking sites, as well as a forceful monopoly over educational institutions such as schools, institutes, universities, and summer camps. Additionally, the group has hijacked mosques and Qur'anic study facilities, mobilizing tribal leaders, sheikhs, and notables through subterfuge, abduction, and pressure.

The report concludes with a number of recommendations addressed to the conflict parties and relevant organizations, most notably:

- Mayyun calls on all parties to fully adhere to the international agreements ratified by the Republic of Yemen, to immediately stop recruiting children, to demobilize all

children involved in armed conflict, and to refer entities, individuals, and civilian and military leaders to the judiciary for deterrent punishment.

- Mayyun calls on all parties to provide psychological and social rehabilitation to recruited children before returning them to their communities, due to the potential effects of violence on the children who have been recruited and on their local communities and families.
- Mayyun urges the Houthi group/ Ansar Allah to form joint working teams with the UN and civil society to mass demobilize children recruited into its ranks, to halt ongoing mobilization and recruitment campaigns, to launch a psychological and social rehabilitation program for child recruits, to reintegrate them into society, and to broadcast this information through various media outlets.
- Mayyun urges the Houthi group/ Ansar Allah to abide by international agreements and the Global Safe Schools Declaration, which prohibits the use of schools for military purposes, and to refrain from using educational institutions, public spaces, and summer camps to enlist children and subject them to weapon training and military mobilization.
- Mayyun urges the Houthi group/ Ansar Allah to unconditionally and constructively engage international and local organizations in the issue of children and armed conflicts, as well

- as to provide access to information gathering and protection programs for children recruited in and affected by the war.
- Mayyun calls on the Houthi group/ Ansar Allah to stop exploiting and recruiting children from African refugee and migrant families into armed conflicts, and to stop indoctrinating them into a culture of prejudice and sectarianism, as this is in violation of the Refugee Convention and the protocol attached to the Convention.
 - Mayyun welcomes the Presidential Leadership Council's decision to form the Military Committee to restructure the armed forces. It urges the Military Committee to take all necessary steps to restructure the Armed Forces with anti-child recruitment policies, in collaboration with the joint committee established by Cabinet Resolution No. (91) 2018.
 - Mayyun calls on the international community and the United Nations to consider sustainable peace as one that is in the interest of the victims, particularly children and women, who are the real stakeholders in peace. Children affected by the conflict will suffer the longer the conflict lasts, as they constitute the future generation.
 - Mayyun calls on the international community to exert more pressure on the Houthi group by imposing sanctions on those responsible for child recruitment, including travel restrictions and legal prosecution.
- Mayyun calls on the Special Representative of the United Nations Secretary-General for Children and Armed Conflict to visit Yemen for first-hand observation and assessment of the recruitment of child soldiers.
 - Mayyun urges the Group of Experts on Yemen to sanction the Houthi entities and individuals mentioned in the Under-Secretary-General on Children and Armed Conflict's annual report on Children in Armed Conflict due to the effectiveness of the measure in deterring violations of children's rights.

Context and Background

On June 18, 2004, a six-year long war called the «Six Wars of Saada» broke out between the Houthi group and the Yemeni government and ended in February 2010. Following the war, the United Nations began monitoring cases of child recruitment, and the President of the United Nations Security Council issued statements criminalizing the recruitment of children, as that stands in defiance of international law and relevant United Nations Security Council Resolutions No. 1539 (2004), 1612 (2005), 1882 (2009), and 1998 (2011).

This is in addition to the report submitted by the Secretary-General of the United Nations at the sixty-eighth session of the Security Council (A/67845-/S/201324/) on children and armed conflict, and the conclusions adopted by the United Nations Security Council Working Group on Children and Armed Conflict in Yemen.

The Secretary-General's 2011 report on children, armed conflict, and the recruitment and use of children listed the Houthi rebels and armed tribes loyal to the government for the first time. In 2012, the Yemeni Armed Forces, Ansar al-Sharia, and the 1st Armored Division were added.

With Yemen involved in the events of 2011 and the parties signing the Gulf Initiative in 2012, the Yemeni government and the United Nations began a dialogue to end the recruitment of children, signing a joint plan on May 14, 2014. Prior to that, Ms. Laila Zarrouqi, Under-Secretary-General, visited Yemen in 2012 and met with leaders from the Houthi group in Saada Governorate. In the meeting, she announced their commitment to end the recruitment of children in armed conflicts in accordance with United Nations procedures.

Following the Houthis' takeover of Sanaa in September 2014 and the Arab coalition's military intervention in Yemen, child recruitment remained a humanitarian priority on the political agenda, especially with the conflict's expansion and the plurality of conflicting parties and entities. The United Nations reported serious violations of children's rights by new entities that were added to the 2018 report of the Under-Secretary-General on Children and Armed Conflict.

In July 2018, the UN initiated negotiations with the internationally recognized Yemeni government to

reactivate the 2014 plan. A roadmap was signed to restructure the Joint Technical Committee, ensuring that it convenes on a regular basis and that anti-child recruiting rules are implemented. On April 18, 2022, following UN consultations, the Houthi armed group signed a plan with the UN.

The reporting period, 2021–2022, witnessed several political and humanitarian occurrences involving children and armed conflict, including:

- Conflict escalation in Marib, Taiz, Al-Dhalea, Shabwa, and Al-Bayda.
- The United Nations mediated a humanitarian truce in April 2022.
- Yemeni government forces were removed from the blacklist of child recruiters following progress made in the government's Action Plan and a considerable reduction in the number of infractions against children. Completion of all outstanding activities listed in the Action Plan, as well as a sustained reduction in child recruitment by the Yemeni Armed Forces, were prerequisites to the delisting.
- The United Nations will conduct a 12-month continuous monitoring process to ensure the sustainability of all existing measures and continued cooperation. Failure to comply in any way will result in re-designation in the upcoming report⁽¹⁾.
- The Houthi group and the UN adopted an action plan to safeguard

children, prevent grave violations during armed conflict, prohibit the recruitment of minors, identify child soldiers, demobilize them within six months, and reintegrate them into society.

During the war's nine-year period, all sides have inevitably continued to violate international humanitarian law. The Houthis and the internationally recognized government have both engaged in varying degrees of forced and voluntary recruitment of minors, subjecting them to military training, involving them in direct combat, or assigning them to provide auxiliary services to fighters.

Homelessness, internal displacement, and the deterioration of living services

and the economy in Yemen are major reasons for ongoing child recruitment, followed by the Houthi leaders' control over security, relief, and humanitarian institutions.

Mayyun Organization for Human Right's second report, entitled Child Warriors, monitors, documents, and analyzes violations of child recruitment and involvement in armed actions from July 1, 2021, until December 31, 2022. Due to the serious repercussions and impacts that may befall children and society if the infringing parties fail to abide by local, national, and international laws and UN-brokered action plans, the Mayyun organization remains dedicated to addressing these grave infractions.



Legal and Institutional Context of Children and Armed Conflict in Yemen

International Agreements Ratified by Yemen

National Legislation

According to Article (149) of Child Rights Law No. (45) of 2002⁽²⁾, the state shall seek to uphold international law in relation to armed situations involving children by:

1. Prohibiting the use of weapons against minors.
2. Shielding children from the consequences of armed conflict.
3. Providing protection for children involved in retaliatory disputes.
4. Keeping children out of armed conflict.
5. Prohibiting the recruitment of anyone under the age of eighteen.

Article (139) of the Police Authority Law, paragraph (2), states that applicants for police positions must be between the ages of 18 and 25⁽³⁾.

Article (4) paragraph (B) of Law No. (23) of 1990 concerning the general reserve additionally states that the reserve should be composed of all male citizens aged eighteen to fifty years, and that Yemen is determined to avoid the involvement of children in violent conflicts and to safeguard them⁽⁴⁾.

Article (3) of Law No. (22) of 1990 and its amendments regarding national conscription: National military service, including service in the armed forces and security, is obligatory for every Yemeni man over eighteen⁽⁵⁾.

International human rights law and international humanitarian law have guaranteed special protection for children. As the group most susceptible to voluntary or forced recruitment, their participation in conflicts may have serious ramifications for their physical and mental safety.

The International Criminal Court also considers crimes against children to be grave threats to international peace and security. The court also considers forced or voluntary recruitment of minors as a war crime whose perpetrators are subject to punishment, whether in international or non-international armed conflicts. Parties to the conflict who recruit minors are also added to the Secretary-General's annual blacklist.

International humanitarian law obliges regular armed forces to take proactive measures to safeguard civilians, especially vulnerable children, at an early stage to protect them against recruitment in armed conflicts. The Geneva Convention, which Yemen has ratified, mandates the protection of children and women from involvement in armed conflicts.

In May 1990, the Republic of Yemen ratified the Convention on the Rights of the Child, which is universally supported. The definition of «child» under the

Convention relates to every human being under the age of eighteen⁽⁶⁾.

In August 2004, Yemen ratified the Optional Protocol to the Convention on the Rights of the Child on the involvement of children in armed conflict⁽⁷⁾. The protocol obligates parties to take all practical measures to ensure the non-participation of minors in hostilities and the inadmissibility of forced recruitment.

Article (4) of the protocol states it is illegal for armed groups to recruit and involve those under the age of eighteen in hostilities. These legal texts are binding for all parties to the conflict in Yemen without exception, and child rights violators are subject to prosecution and inclusion on the UN's blacklist.

Notably, the Republic of Yemen has ratified several treaties that stipulate the preservation of children's rights and dignity and prohibits their exploitation. Among these accords are the Optional Protocol on the Rights of the Child on the sale and exploitation of children in prostitution and pornography⁽⁸⁾, and Convention No. (182), which addresses the most heinous kinds of child labor. Both prohibit the exploitation of children and their employment in labor that is incompatible with their physical and psychological natures⁽⁹⁾.

Institutional Framework

To better protect children in Yemen, the Yemeni government signed an action plan with the UN in May 2014 to end the recruitment of minors by the country's military forces. This strategy calls for demobilizing all children from government security forces, reintegrating them into their communities, and preventing their re-enlistment. Strategic procedures include issuing and publicizing military orders barring the recruitment of minors, reviewing reports of child recruitment by Yemeni government forces, and holding those culpable accountable⁽¹⁰⁾.

In continuation of these efforts, on December 18, 2018, the internationally recognized government of Yemen signed an updated roadmap with the United Nations Country Working Group for Monitoring and Reporting, which complies with the 2014 joint UN plan to end the recruitment of children.

In February 2012, during a meeting held in Saada Governorate by the Special Representative of the Secretary of the United Nations for Children and Armed Conflict, Abdul Malik al-Houthi, the leader of the Houthi group, affirmed his commitment to end the recruitment of children into the ranks of his armed group⁽¹¹⁾.

With the progression of Yemen's conflict, and mounting international pressure on the Houthi group to sign a plan to prevent child recruitment, the Houthi group conceded to implement an action plan to end child recruitment and reintegrate child soldiers into society on April 18, 2022⁽¹²⁾.

Methodological Framework

The methodology used by the Mayyun Organization for Human Rights to track and record instances of child recruiting breaches is based on international standards to identify the profiles of child recruits, trends and methods of recruitment, and tasks allocated to them.

In this report, the organization determined the ages of the child victims killed in combat using their families' statements, official birth certificates, educational levels during recruitment, or school documents. It also relied on technical specialists to analyze video recordings and photos broadcast by the official media of the Houthi group.

To ascertain patterns used to draft children into military service, the organization also relied on eyewitnesses and testimonies from the families and friends of the victims, and analyzed recordings and statements broadcast through the media and websites of the Houthi group.

The organization also tracked recruitment cases through multiple sources in security and military sites, held direct and indirect communication with families of victims, witnesses, and activists, requested written and audio statements from civilian and military eyewitnesses, and procured records from health centers, hospitals, and care institutions for the families of the victims.

Regarding the information use policy, the organization has informed the victims' families and eyewitnesses that their statements might be used in this report, and that they have the right to reserve the publication of their names and data in the report and retain complete confidentiality.

The organization strives to document evidence to identify victims and perpetrators through analyzing video recordings and statements of leaders of the Houthi armed group on its affiliated media⁽¹³⁾, as well as speeches of incitement, hatred, intellectual and cultural mobilization, and ideological indoctrination that students encounter in schools, summer centers, and training centers.

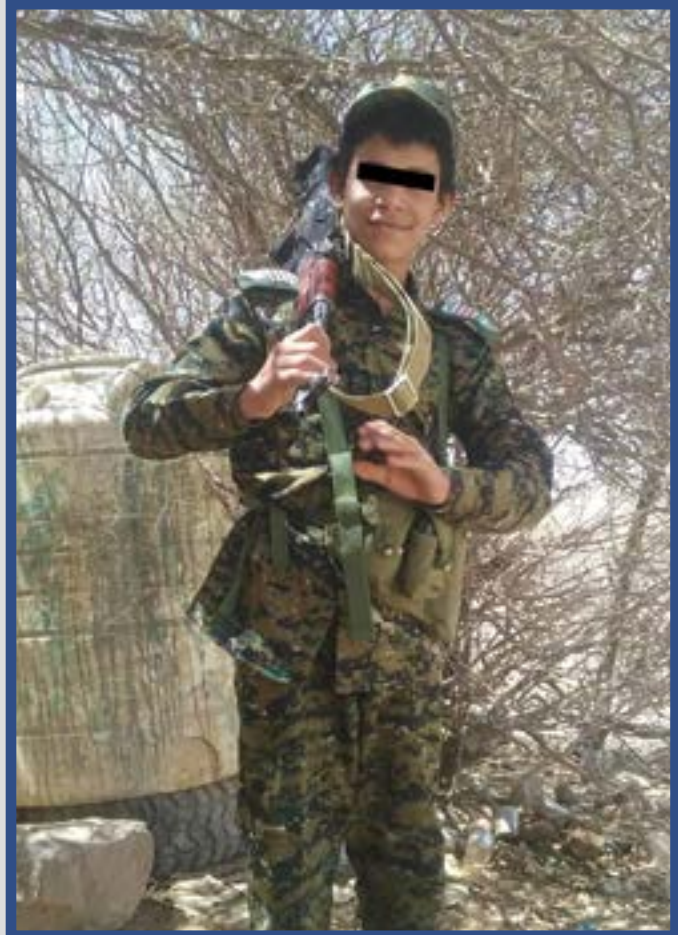
The evidence was also used to determine the Houthis' strategies for recruiting and training new fighters, enlisting children in combat to provide fighters with support services, and dealing with the families of victims when children are killed or injured while taking part in front-line combat.

It should be emphasized that the figures presented in this study do not accurately reflect the final numbers for victim counts and recruiting trends. Instead, the figures and trends provided were charted under incredibly challenging conditions, particularly in regions under the control of the Houthi armed organization.

The organization spoke with military personnel in the internationally recognized Yemeni government's armed forces and examined official medical records and other documents pertaining to the victims' social care. Researchers from the organization conducted personal interviews to gather statements and testimonies via several social media platforms, including WhatsApp, Signal, and Telegram, as well as through email.



Accountability, Justice Mechanisms, and Preventing Criminal Impunity

Under all circumstances, international accords stipulate support for national judicial redress procedures by relying on legal provisions and aligning them with international humanitarian law, international human rights law, and Yemen-ratified treaties. In the event that national processes fail, international mechanisms have the authority to investigate proven violations according to international standards depending on the conflict situation.

National Accountability Mechanisms

With Yemen entering non-international armed conflict, international humanitarian and human rights law apply with reference to the Security Council's 2014 resolutions and recommendations⁽¹⁴⁾, to establish the National Commission to Investigate Alleged Violations to Human Rights

(NCIAVHR) committed on the territory of the Republic of Yemen by all the parties.

This commission was established pursuant to Republican Resolution No. (140) of 2012 and its amendments, and based on the texts of the Gulf Initiative and its executive mechanism, Council Resolution No. (2051) of 2014⁽¹⁵⁾, and the decisions of the Human Rights Council.

The presidential decree relegated tasks to the commission and authorized it to investigate human rights violations, including child recruitment. But while the commission successfully investigated many violations and referred them to the Public Prosecution, no perpetrators of child recruitment actually faced prosecution. In addition, the Houthi group refused to recognize the commission and barred its activities in its areas of control, further hindering accountability and justice.

National Accountability Mechanisms

In accordance with Security Council Resolution No. (1612) 2005, a mechanism will be established to monitor and report serious violations of children's rights in the event that any country enters a state of non-international or international armed conflict. Relevant civil society

organizations will be involved in this mechanism, with the caveat they adhere to international standards for monitoring and documentation.

Yemen's monitoring and reporting commission was created in 2012, and consists of a regional team that documents and regularly delivers reports to the Office of the Secretary-General. These reports are used for assembling the lists of breaches of children's rights⁽¹⁶⁾.

The Office of the Secretary-General partners with the Security Council Group of Experts on Violations, which dictates the lists of entities and individuals subject to international sanctions⁽¹⁷⁾.

Mayyun demands the sanctioning of conflict parties breaching children's rights, and for violating entities to abide by their agreements with the United Nations to halt child recruitment.

Monitoring and Documentation of Child Recruitment in Armed Actions from July 1, 2021, until December 31, 2022

From July 1, 2021 to December 31, 2022, the Mayyun Organization monitored the recruitment of 2,233 children and their involvement in the armed conflict by the parties to the conflict in Yemen, although the actual number is likely greater.

The report concluded that 2,209 children have been verifiably recruited by the Houthi group/Ansar Allah on the front lines, representing 98.9% of total incidents covered in this report. Meanwhile, the internationally recognized Yemeni government and its affiliated armed formation recruited and involved 24 children in armed actions, representing 1.1% of total incidents.

Mayyun has verified that 1,309 children, including a Somali child, were killed in Houthi ranks, and 351 children were injured and maimed during frontline action. The report also documented the deaths of 556 children in Houthi ranks. These children had been granted military ranks varying between officers and non-commissioned officers, with 753 other children given the status of soldiers in official Houthi lists⁽¹⁸⁾⁽¹⁹⁾⁽²⁰⁾⁽²¹⁾⁽²²⁾⁽²³⁾⁽²⁴⁾.

The internationally recognized Yemeni government's military and allied armed formations recruited a total of 24 children, 18 of whom were confirmed to be military commanders' children, with their duty confined to escorting those

officials, while 6 were active in frontlines and checkpoints.

The organization has received reports of fraudulent recruiting instances in the Yemeni government forces that fall within financial and administrative corruption, since the objective of recruitment is for their parents to obtain monthly wages and financial benefits. Due to the difficulties of ascertaining the exact numbers, the organization anticipates the numbers to be far greater than what was tracked.

The monitoring data shows that during the period of relative calm that followed the truce extension, there was a fall in the number of child soldier victims.

However, the Houthi armed group exploited the suspension of hostilities to mobilize, enlist, and train additional juvenile recruits in clear defiance of its duties under the plan negotiated with the United Nations on April 18, 2022.

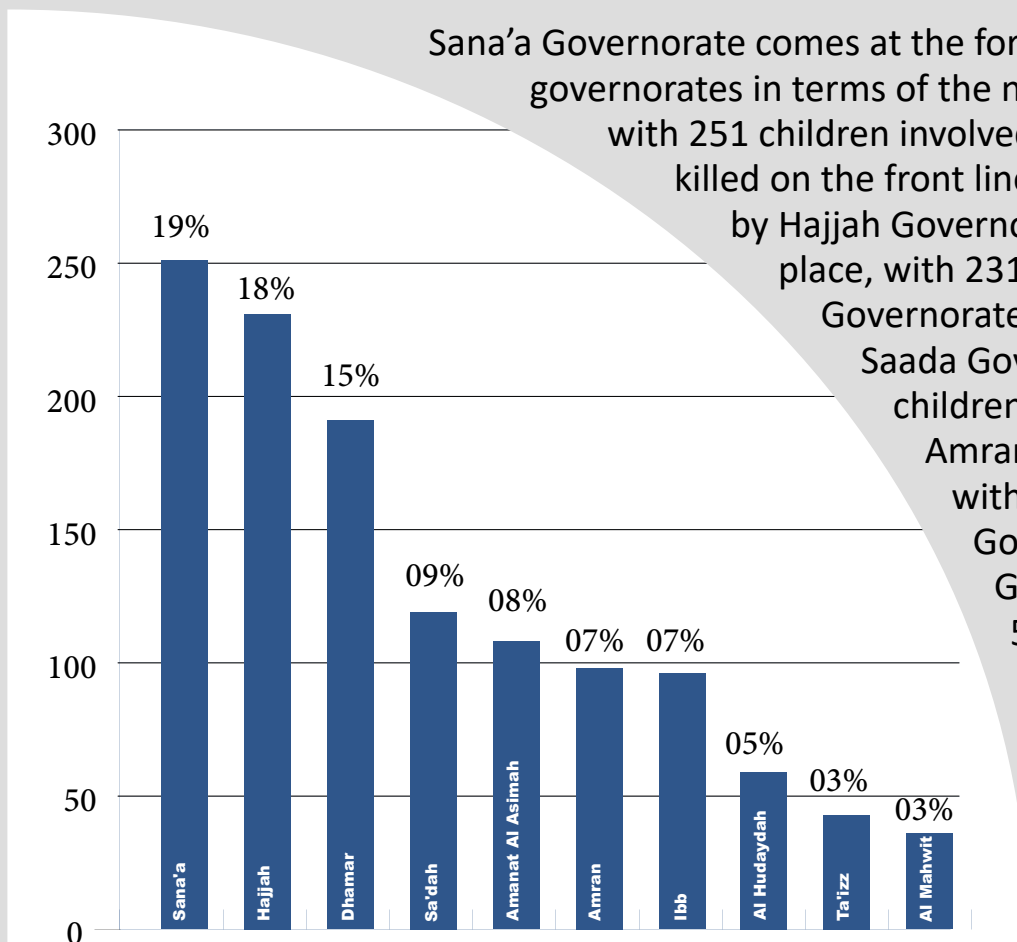

Class and Geographic Distribution of Victims

The organization’s data suggests that the regions where child recruits are situated are characterized by tightened security by armed groups in tandem with acute poverty.



Sana'a Governorate comes at the forefront of Yemeni governorates in terms of the number of victims, with 251 children involved in armed actions killed on the front lines. It was followed by Hajjah Governorate in second place, with 231 children, Dhamar Governorate, with 191 children, Saada Governorate, with 119 children, Amanat Al-Asima, Amran Governorate, with 98 children, Ibb Governorate, Hodeidah Governorate, with 59 children, Houthi-controlled Taiz Governorate, with 43 children, and Al-Mahwit Governorate.

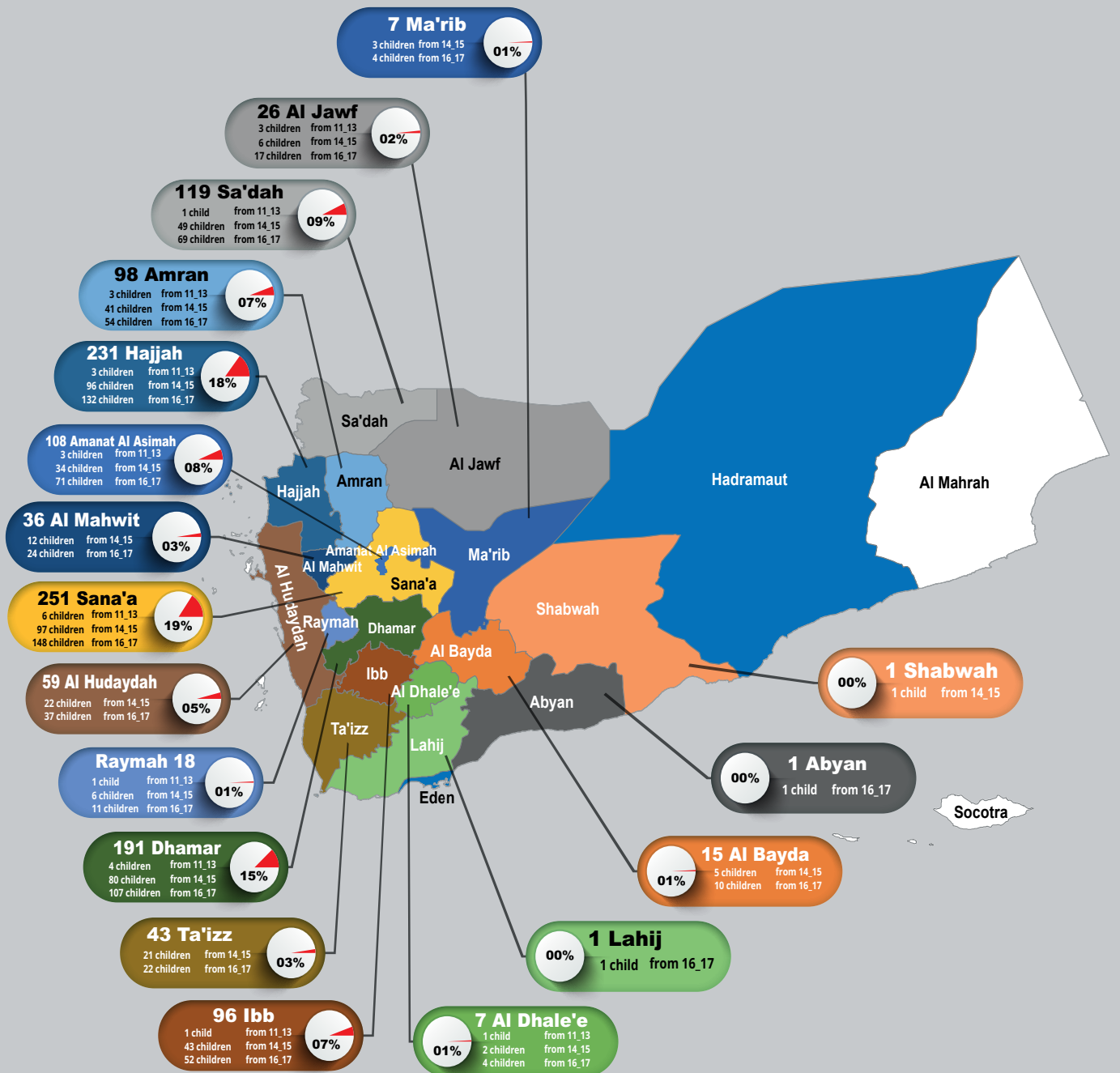
Age Groups of Recruitment Victims

Sorting and analyzing the victim database revealed that children between the ages of sixteen and seventeen are most exposed to recruitment as soldiers by the Houthi group.

The 1617- age group ranked first in terms of prevalence, with 764 children, followed by the 1415- age group, with 518 children, and the third, the 1113- age group, with 26 children. The incidence of the latter age group is highest in the governorates of Sana'a, with 6 children, followed by Dhamar with 4 children, and Amanat Al-Asima, Al-Jawf, Hajjah and Amran, with 3 children in each governorate.

As for the age group 1415-, Sana'a Governorate topped the list with 97 children, followed by Hajjah Governorate with 96 children, then Dhamar Governorate with 80 children, and Saada Governorate with 47 children.

Military Ranks Granted to Child Soldiers

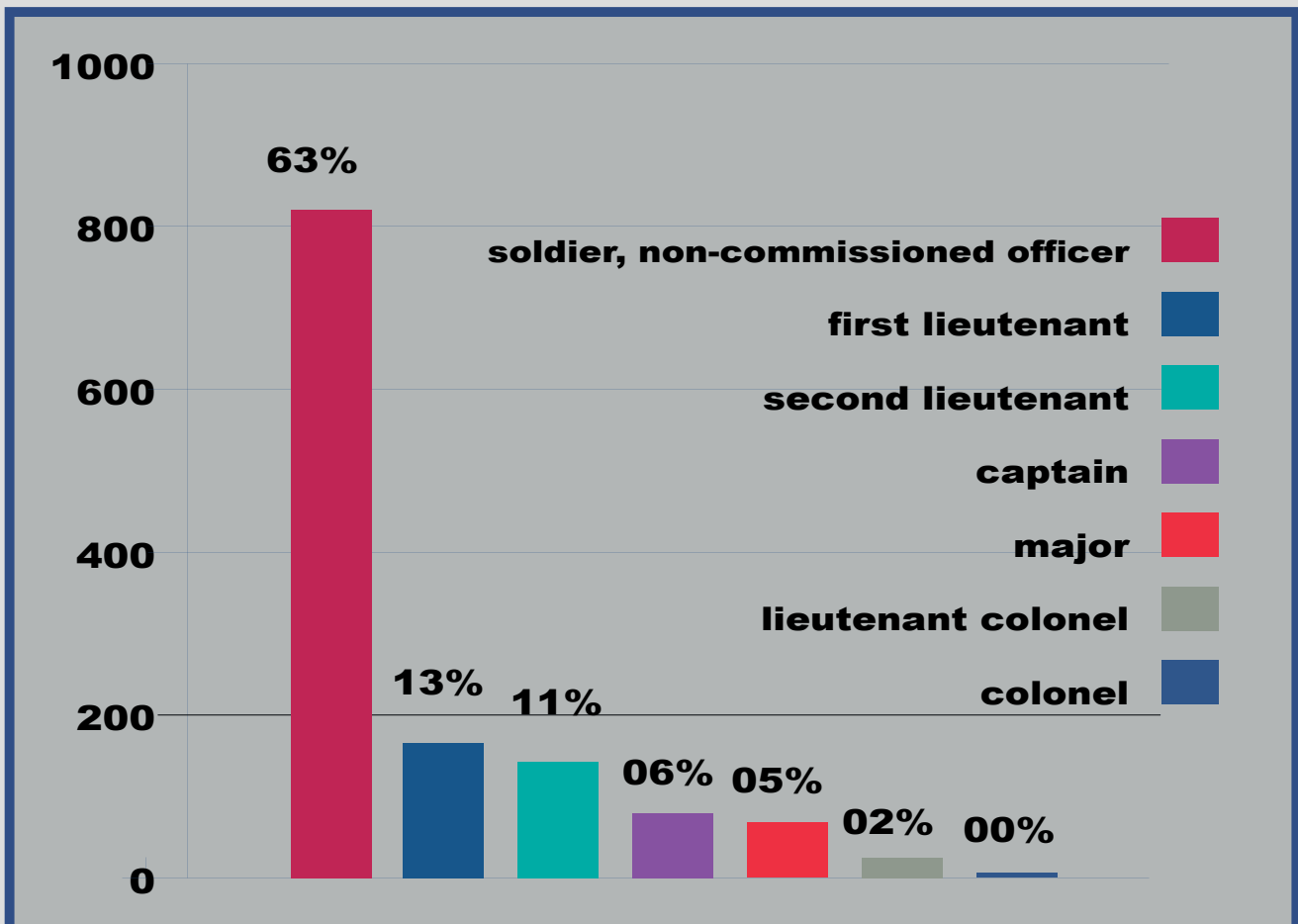
The organization concluded that the Houthi group lured children into its troops by assigning them unwarranted ranks—without legal merit—as a form of encouragement. Monitoring indicators confirmed that 6 children received the ranking of colonel, 25 of lieutenant colonel, 68 of major, 79 of captain, 149 of second lieutenant, 166 of first lieutenant, and 821 of soldier, non-commissioned officer, or assistant.

When examining the Law of Service in the Yemeni Armed Forces No. (67) of 1991 and its amendments, Article 30, and the time necessary to advance to a higher military rank, the Houthi group’s

fraudulent conduct to recruit children is thrown into sharp relief.

If a child enlisted at the start of the conflict, for instance, it would take him nine years to advance to the rank of first lieutenant (see the legal framework for promotion under the law)⁽²⁵⁾. This demonstrates that the military ranks are contrived and have no legal validity. Rather, the Houthi group intends to entice minors into military service through deception.

The following chart shows the division of child soldiers according to the military ranks granted to them.

Tasks Assigned to Child Soldiers

Monitoring data indicate that most of the child recruits killed in Houthi ranks during the reporting period were directly involved in the war and were forced to carry out dangerous military tasks.

The Houthi group assigned 350 children to leadership roles, including command of groups of fighters on the battlefield, command of landmine planting teams, and command of security personnel at checkpoints on roads linking governorates and within cities.

The monitoring teams also documented the deaths of 15 children working in what the Houthi group calls “military media”⁽²⁶⁾⁽²⁷⁾⁽²⁸⁾⁽²⁹⁾⁽³⁰⁾⁽³¹⁾. Prior to their deaths, the children were tasked with filming clashes on the battlefronts and carrying out military reconnaissance on the frontlines.

635 of the children recruited by the Houthi group were tasked with frontline combat and/or planting landmine fields, while the rest of them participated indirectly in the war before they were killed.

Children engaging in the battle indirectly performed «logistical» duties, such as cooking, transporting munitions, food, and khat to the fronts, and driving troop transport vehicles (military crews).

Polarization and Child Recruitment

Eyewitnesses told Mayuun Organization that the Houthis (Ansar Allah) armed group used systematically polarized methods to recruit children. The total number of recruited children into Ansar Allah ranks reached (2,209)⁽³²⁾⁽³³⁾⁽³⁴⁾.

While the number of recruited children within the armed forces of the Internationally- recognized Government was (24) children. The Organization investigated the reasons behind recruitment of those children.

The Organization found out also that some military Commanders used their own children in the recruitment process.

In the upcoming section, the report will discuss the methodology, trends, and tools of polarization and conscription carried out by the Houthi armed group, which has carried out 99.8% of violations, which portends a grave risk to the future of children living in areas under its control.

The organization is still investigating a number of reports received about the Houthi group forming specialized institutions and schools for recruitment, known as “Martyr of the Qur’an”⁽³⁵⁾ schools. That title is in reference to the founder of the Houthi group, Hussein Badr al-Din, who was killed by Yemeni government forces during the First Saada War on September 10, 2004⁽³⁶⁾.

The group has also established the Imam Al-Hadi Foundation⁽³⁷⁾, the Martyr Zaid Ali Musleh Foundation⁽³⁸⁾ in Saada, and the Islamic Forum Foundation in Hajjah^{(39) (40) (41)}, all of which receive direct political and financial support from the office of the group's leader, Abdul Malik Badr. This is in addition to the General Authority for Zakat and the General Authority for Endowments⁽⁴²⁾, which were established after the group's seizure of Sana'a.

It should be noted that the outlined conscription trends have been verified through statements, testimonies, and reports. The organization is still investigating the use of other means and patterns.

Methods of Recruitment

Local residents have reported that due to the lack of fighters among the Houthis, the group has sought to attract fighters regardless of age and by any means necessary.

Exploiting the living and economic circumstances of children and their families is one of the main ways the Houthi group recruits children for armed conflict. This is followed by a strategy of ideological indoctrination and incitement through public and private media outlets and social networking sites, as well as total control over educational institutions such as schools, institutes, universities⁽⁴³⁾, and summer camps through the use of force. Additionally, the group has hijacked mosques and Qur'anic study facilities, mobilizing tribal leaders, sheikhs, and notables through subterfuge, abduction, and pressure.

The Recruitment of 14 year-old Abdullah

Ahmed (pseudonym), the victim's 40 years old neighbor, says in his documented testimony, "Abdullah's family was able to pull the child out of a makeshift training camp disguised as a football field in the city of Dhamar."

However, that stint was shortlived, and Abdullah returned to the camp. As soon as his family was able to bring him home again, camp counselors demanded his return, and he acquiesced. This cycle went on several times.

Ahmed explains that Abdullah Omara received a «cultural» course at the Houthi economic establishment on Al-Zubairi Street, from which he graduated with radical, sectarian ideas that have led him to abandon his family and education and join the fighting fronts in Marib.

Ahmed concluded his testimony by saying that Abdullah's family expressed fears that the child, who could not fight, would follow in the footsteps of children who had died on the fronts.

I. Exploiting Living and Economic Conditions

The majority of the population in Houthi-controlled areas suffers from dire living conditions, as the collapse of the currency has led to a sharp rise in the prices of food and other goods and a decline in purchasing power.

The continued interruption of employee salaries and the deliberate division of the banking system have created discrepancies in currency exchange rates and led to deductions in financial transfers from expatriate funds. Citizens around the country are presently suffering from poor economic conditions and a lack of essential services⁽⁴⁴⁾.

Based on the reports fielded, the organization has concluded that the primary driver of the Houthi group's recruitment of minors, both voluntarily and forcibly, is the dire conditions endured by millions of residents in Houthi-controlled regions.

According to the families of children who died in armed conflicts, the guardians consented to the children's involvement in warfare despite being aware of the risks. They claimed that their permission was driven by the urgent need for food, medication, and other necessities.

Due to violent conflicts, many of these families had been uprooted from their homelands. Other families, the majority of whom reside in rural areas, have witnessed serious deterioration in their living situations, and their children have stopped attending school in order to help support the family.

II. Restricting Humanitarian Aid to Recruit Children

Reports have indicated that the Houthi Security and Intelligence Service and supervisory authorities have exercised heightened control over humanitarian aid and food supplies to beneficiaries⁽⁴⁵⁾.

This arbitrary allocation of resources led to the exacerbation of an already fragile living situation for impoverished families, enabling the Houthi group to exploit weakened households, with defenseless children as the new currency.

Monthly relief supplies are exchanged for the children's conscription and enrollment in "cultural" courses. After completing these courses, children are usually hauled off to combat training camps⁽⁴⁶⁾.

According to citizen testimonies, growing societal refusal to give up their children to the war prompted the Houthi group to blackmail destitute families with their monthly allotment of food aid. The group controlled aid supplies under a designated institution titled the Supreme Council for Coordination and Management of Humanitarian Affairs and International Cooperation, and it selected beneficiaries and arbitrarily distributed relief items under complex, mostly doctrinal terms⁽⁴⁷⁾.

According to the accounts of the families of the victims named below, the impoverished families succumbed to the Houthis' maximalist demands to obtain relief items, with many having to show their commitment to the group to escape torture and security prosecution.

In this context, the organization's team received reports in January 2022 submitted by residents of the Maqvana District in Taiz Governorate, alluding to similar blackmail operations carried out by leaders of the Houthi group with the complicity of affiliated humanitarian organizations⁽⁴⁸⁾.

III. Indoctrination and Hate Speech

According to civilian testimonies, the Houthis use indoctrination and hate speech to mobilize and recruit children⁽⁴⁹⁾⁽⁵⁰⁾, typically broadcast on video and audio Houthi-run media and news outlets⁽⁵¹⁾.

The Houthis' methods of recruitment include, but are not limited to, hijacking educational institutions, mandating chanting of sectarian slogans⁽⁵²⁾⁽⁵³⁾, declaring opponents and dissidents as infidels, exploiting and employing teachers in mobilization and recruitment operations, and spreading hate speech through the media, social networking sites, mosques and places of worship.

A. Controlling the Decision Center in Educational and Pedagogical Institutions

According to data from the monitoring team, educational facilities in areas controlled by the Houthi group are the most optimal facilities to polarize children and indoctrinate them with sectarian ideology⁽⁵⁴⁾⁽⁵⁵⁾.

The appointment of the brother of the official of the Houthi group, Yahya Badr al-Din al-Houthi, at the head of the pyramid of the educational institution helped precipitate the recruitment process. In his role as Minister of Education, he was able to impose broad changes on school principals and suspend, transfer, and replace staff with sectarian loyalists.

Major General Qasim Qasim Hamran was appointed as both Deputy Minister of Education and commander of one of the Houthi military forces known as the Support Forces, which are involved in child conscription. He also supervises the Ministry of Technical and Vocational Education and the Ministry of Higher Education in Sana'a⁽⁵⁶⁾.

Citizen A.M., who previously served as the director of a government school in the Sana'a Governorate, alleges that he was suspended for voicing his disapproval of measures to assign third-year high school students weekly firearm training.

He stated in his written testimony that the Houthi supervisor in the governorate proposed weekly Wednesday training of sixty-five students in the third year of high school. He agreed initially, but after consulting with regional tribesmen, he rescinded his approval to the supervisor, claiming the people were firmly opposed to the order. The supervisor responded by insulting and threatening him and his community.

A.M. concluded his testimony by saying that the Director General of Education in the Directorate suspended him from work and appointed a Houthi loyalist in his stead.

During the last four years of the conflict, the organization documented scores of deviations in school curriculum, particularly in fundamental stages, all of which sanctified the group's leaders and incited violence and bigotry.

According to data and information verified by the organization, the Houthi armed group designated a cultural supervisor for every public and private school and assigned him supreme powers to make decisions, polarize and recruit, and suspend or expel teachers and students alike.

B. Imposing Sectarian Chants

Citizens who were forcibly displaced from Sana'a, the nation's capital, said that their displacement was driven by concern for their children's safety due to the negative impacts of the ideological indoctrination methods used in schools.

According to testimonies and video recordings collected by the organization, all public and private schools in regions ruled by the armed Houthi group enforce the Houthi chant on students and teachers, a pattern the group has maintained since its inception.

In morning assemblies, students are typically greeted with sectarian sermons delivered by the cultural supervisors. In

addition, specialized classes are allotted to disseminate the Houthi doctrine, with curricular textbooks reformulated and modified to reflect the group's ideologies.

The Houthis' slogan is readily chanted, evoking prejudice within children towards entities that oppose the Houthis' conduct, further trapping them in a cycle of violence.

The slogan is not only verbally regurgitated, but it also features on classroom walls, notebooks, and posters, to further cement the notions within the minds of malleable primary school students, whose belief systems are still under development.

C. demonizing Ideological Opponents

According to the families of victims, the Houthi armed group continues to polarize recruits through inflammatory rhetoric, painting opponents as "infidels." The purpose of this is to take advantage of children's religious fervor and inspire them to rebel against their families and join fighter ranks to battle said «infidels.» This standpoint drives overzealous children to advanced frontlines under inhumane conditions, completely disproportionate to their physical and psychological capabilities.

D. Exploiting Teachers in Mobilization and Recruitment Operations

Teachers at Houthi-controlled schools play a significant role in ideological indoctrination and promoting hate speech to entice and recruit students, according to verified testimonials from workers in the educational field.

Child recruitment through teachers was particularly effective in the governorates of Sana'a, Dhamar, Ibb, Raymah, Hajjah, and Saada.

According to testimonies of teachers who previously worked in schools supervised by Houthi field leaders, many teachers assume the duties of cultural supervisors, social workers, and activities specialists. By taking on multiple roles, teachers can begin to build profiles on most of the students in the school and learn more about them.

School activities can have profound impacts on children's behavior. As such, social and cultural supervisors and activities specialists conducted school trips to Houthi-held cemeteries and imposed arbitrary restrictions on school radio and art classes, among others. The implemented activities aim to instill loyalty to the group, painting militants as brave heroes backed by divine support⁽⁵⁷⁾, and calling upon children to join their so-called "Quranic Path"⁽⁵⁸⁾.

E. Summer Camps

Summer centers, both operational and non-operational, are among the most influential methods for systematically polarizing children through ideological indoctrination and hate speech.

Based on videos and statements found on the official websites of the Houthi armed group, thousands of summer centers are being launched for male and female students in all governorates and regions under Houthi control^{(59) (60) (61)}.

As of 2022, there are a total of 8,990 summer centers, with the total number of students enrolled in those centers reaching 719,721 male and female students⁽⁶²⁾.

The organization's sources indicate that the summer centers last for forty-five days, during which students undergo intensive sectarian cultural courses and intellectual mobilization.

According to video recordings retrieved by the organization, the group utilizes closed summer centers to militarily train children on various weapons as they chant sectarian slogans⁽⁶³⁾.

F. Media and Social Networking Sites

The Houthi militia are keen to spread their message on their media outlets and social networking sites, in visual and audio format, to recruit and ideologically indoctrinate fighters regardless of age and to propagate hate speech. Children are not exempt from the media's influence.

Dozens of videos published on Houthi media outlets, and others exclusively sourced, feature statements made by child recruits demanding their inclusion on battle fronts and reciting their commandments before they are accompanied to advanced combat positions⁽⁶⁴⁾⁽⁶⁵⁾⁽⁶⁶⁾⁽⁶⁷⁾.

According to family testimonies, the Houthis use the WhatsApp messaging platform to circulate jihadist songs to raise the morale of fighters in its ranks. Cultural supervisors in schools forcibly enter the phone numbers of child students into online groups, on which they share visual recordings of the leader of the Houthi group, the group's lieutenant, and armed battles.

G. Mosques and Places of Worship

Statistics and evidence suggest that the armed Houthi organization began, from the outset, to exploit mosques for the objectives of polarization, ideological indoctrination, and fostering the culture of hatred.

Children are the group most susceptible to manipulation, enrollment in weapons training courses, and conscription. However, during the reporting period, there was a relative decline in child polarization through mosque sermons or educational sessions due to the reluctance of most local residents in Houthi-controlled areas to attend mosques.

IV. Subterfuge and Abduction

Subterfuge and abduction are interwoven in terms of strategy and implementation.

The recruiting process begins with deceit and concludes with kidnapping the child to advanced sites for involvement in armed operations. Sources also indicate that the group maintains the same mode of operation as delineated through our report entitled “Children, Not Guns” issued in early 2021⁽⁶⁸⁾.

According to testimonies gathered by the organization throughout the reporting period, the bulk of instances of recruitment of minors were carried out through deception and abduction, mainly in the governorates of Sana’a, Hajjah, Amran, Hodeidah, Ibb, Saada, Dhamar, and Amanat Al-Asimah.

Recruitment operations in this pattern begin by assuring families that their children will stay within their governorates, and that their jobs will be to offer insurance services at checkpoints and security and military sites.

After several weeks, the children are transferred to other governorates, such as Sanaa, Amanat Al-Asimah, and Dhamar, to practice combat training and undergo training courses, following which they are dispatched to battle fronts. In many cases, the children die in armed clashes.

To obtain money, food, relief aid, and cash transfers that organizations disburse to impoverished communities, most of the families acquiesce to the group’s conditions, sending out their children to join the cultural courses after receiving guarantees that their children would not be sent to fight on the front lines, and that they would return after completing the cultural courses.

After the duration of the cultural courses, families begin frantically searching for their children through tribal mediators and cultural and political officials. According to reports, approaching the media with information or posting about the missing or abducted children on social media is grounds for imprisonment and prosecution.

Abduction of 13-Year-Old Khaled (Pseudonym), Dhamar Governorate

According to a documented testimony from the victim's relative, In 2021, a district supervisor in Dhamar Governorate recruited Khaled into a cultural course. Unbeknownst to the child's family, the Houthi group relocated him from his neighborhood in Dhamar to Sana'a Governorate, assuring him the course would last one week and that all his expenses would be covered.

After searching for days, the family learned that their child had been recruited to fight in the ranks of the Houthi group on the front lines. The father then contacted officials in the governorate and offered a bounty of 200 thousand riyals, but to no avail. Five months later, the child was killed on the front lines and battles of the Houthi group in Marib Governorate, and the family and surrounding community welcomed the child's casket with profound sorrow.

V. Intimidation of Tribal Leaders and Sheikhs

Tribal sheikhs and elders in areas controlled by the Houthi group reported feeling pressured into recruiting children under their care. Testimonies indicate that the Houthi group attained the elders' loyalty and silence by offering them money and weapons, and exacted punitive measures upon members who defied them. As a result, tribal leaders, sheikhs, and elders aided and abetted in recruiting children, who are still performing combat missions and providing assistance on the front lines of armed clashes.

The Houthi organization maintains its periodic mobilization activities in all regions under its control, employing tactics of inducement and intimidation

of tribal elders, sheikhs, and elders, to encourage locals to push their children, regardless of their age, to join in military actions.

Houthi governors, cultural supervisors, ministers, and field commanders coerced tribal leaders, sheikhs, and elders in the governorates of Al-Bayda, Al-Dhalea, Ibb, Dhamar, Sana'a, Amran, and Hajjah, into polarizing impressionable children.

The organization affirms that many sheikhs and elders have aided in the recruitment of minors under duress, as sheikhs who abstained from engaging in recruitment campaigns or were lax in their efforts were subjected to security prosecution, threats, and imprisonment



Recruitment and Exploitation of Marginalized Communities

In a testimony to Mayyun Organization, Yassin (pseudonym) stated that Houthi leaders have promised an African migrant named Abu Murad Faye' (pseudonym) promotion to the rank of deputy director of a police department if he mobilizes a number of recruits to fight in Houthi ranks.

Yassin added, "In his desire to obtain the position, Abu Murad helped recruit a number of his relatives into the ranks of the Houthi group, who assigned them to the front lines."

The witness explained that among the recruits was Abu Murad's 14 year-old brother, called Ali Faye' (pseudonym). The seventh grader lived with his impoverished family in the Roma neighborhood, Dhamar, and studied at Al-Hassan Al-Hamdani School.

Ali, along with a number of African migrants, was tragically killed in one of the battles. The Houthi group confiscated the child's weapon, the Kalashnikov, after his death.

The witness concluded his testimony by confirming that Abu Murad did not obtain the promised position, and Houthi leaders are still, to this moment, baiting him with the position in a bid to get him to mobilize more fighters.



Psychological Effects of Child Recruitment

Involvement in armed conflict bears serious implications for the physical and emotional well-being of children, whose very character begins to crack under lived trauma. Common emotional consequences for conscripted children included sad moods, preoccupations, depressive thoughts, fears, and anxieties. Physical responses, such as tremors and migraines, may also manifest. In addition, night terrors, eating disorders, sleep disorders, and

societal isolation are common side effects of PTSD, or post traumatic stress disorder.

The reintegration of these children into civilian life is essential to helping them rebuild their lives and contribute to society with their skills and knowledge. The rehabilitation of child survivors necessitates extensive support from state institutions and international humanitarian organizations.



Recommendations

Joint Recommendations to All Parties

- Mayyun Organization urges the all parties to fully adhere to the international agreements ratified by the Republic of Yemen, immediately stop recruiting children, demobilize all children involved in armed conflict, and refer entities, individuals, and civilian and military leaders to the judiciary to receive deterrent punishment.
- Mayyun Organization calls on all parties to the conflict to assume their responsibilities towards the deteriorating humanitarian conditions and their impact on civilians, particularly child soldiers. The parties must also implement economic and humanitarian measures that contribute to improving living conditions, including paying salaries, unifying the banking sector, and allowing the export of oil.
- Mayyun Organization calls on all parties to provide psychological and social rehabilitation to recruited children before returning them to their communities, due to the potential effects of violence on child recruits and their local communities and families.

Recommendations to the Houthi Group/Ansar Allah

- Mayyun organization welcomes the Houthi group's adoption of the joint action plan with the United Nations in April 2022 to halt the recruitment of minors within six months. It urges for the swift execution of the plan, the halt of child involvement in armed conflict, and the protection of human rights under national laws, international treaties ratified by the Republic of Yemen.
- Mayyun Organization urges the Houthi group to form joint working teams with the UN and civil society to document and mass demobilize children recruited into its ranks, to halt ongoing mobilization and recruitment campaigns, to launch a psychological and social rehabilitation program for child recruits, to reintegrate them into society in accordance with international standards, and to broadcast the implementation of these steps through various media outlets.
- Mayyun Organization urges the Houthi group to abide by international agreements and the Global Safe Schools Declaration, which prohibits the use of schools for military purposes, and to refrain from using educational institutions, public spaces, and summer camps to enlist

children and subject them to weapon training and military mobilization.

- Mayyun organization calls for the cessation of systematic indoctrination of sectarianism among children. It highlights the gravity of the psychological and cultural impact incitement may cause, including irreversibly damaging society's values and social fabric.
- Mayyun Organization urges the Houthi group to unconditionally and constructively engage international and local organizations in the issue of children and armed conflicts, as well as to provide access to information gathering and protection programmes for children recruited and affected by the war.
- Mayyun Organization calls on Houthis to stop using humanitarian aid as leverage to pressure Yemeni families and tribes to withdraw their children from schools and to enlist them in summer camps and fighting fronts. It urges the Houthis to pay civil servant wages and to stop using humanitarian assistance as a means of attracting child soldiers.
- Mayyun Organization calls on the Houthi group to stop exploiting and recruiting children from African refugee and migrant families into armed conflicts, and to stop indoctrinating them into a culture of prejudice and sectarianism, as this is in violation of the Refugee Convention and the protocol attached to the Convention.

Recommendations to the Internationally Recognized Yemeni Government

- The government must implement preventive measures to lower child recruitment, including educating military leaders and society about the risk involved. It must also publish information about joint initiatives with the government and the UN, establish a reporting mechanism, and take punitive measures against military and civilian perpetrators involved in child recruitment, in addition to launching a national campaign for awareness-raising targeting military and civilian leaders and other relevant parties.
- Mayyun Organization welcomes the Presidential Leadership Council's decision to form the Military Committee to restructure the armed forces. It urges the Military Committee to take all necessary steps to include anti-child recruiting policies in the government's efforts to restructure the Armed Forces, in collaboration with the joint committee established by Cabinet Resolution No. (91) 2018.
- Mayyun urges the government to form a child protection network composed of government agencies, civil society organizations, and religious and social figures, and to provide facilities to access information and involve affected communities in developing strategies.

- Mayyun urges the government to strengthen accountability systems and mechanisms for receiving complaints, refer perpetrators of violations to justice, provide legal aid to the families of the victims, and facilitate their access to justice.
- Mayyun urges the government to prioritize aid for communities in areas with high rates of child soldiering, and to mobilize international support to deliver sustainable livelihood projects targeting families as well as income-generating projects.
- Mayyun calls for the restructuring and activation of the work of the National Committee to Combat Human Trafficking, given that child soldiering and recruitment in armed conflicts constitutes a human trafficking crime.
- Mayyun calls on the international community to exert more pressure on the Houthi group by imposing sanctions on those responsible for child recruitment, including travel restrictions and legal prosecution.
- Mayyun calls on the international community to prioritize addressing the root causes behind child conscription over demobilization, rehabilitation, and reintegration, to eliminate the threat of child recruitment.
- Mayyun urges the international community to prioritize the prevention of child recruitment and implement action plans that focus on strengthening child protection mechanisms, from education to community awareness.

Recommendations to the United Nations and the International Community

- Mayyun urges the international community and the United Nations to consider sustainable peace as one that is in the interest of the victims, especially children and women, who are the real stakeholders in peace. Children affected by the conflict will suffer the longer the conflict lasts, as they constitute the future generation.
- Mayyun urges the Special Representative of the United Nations Secretary-General for Children and Armed Conflict to visit Yemen for first-hand observation and assessment of the recruitment of child soldiers.

Recommendations to the Special Representative of the United Nations Secretary-General for Children and Armed Conflict

- Mayyun calls on the Special Representative of the United Nations Secretary-General for Children and Armed Conflict to visit Yemen for first-hand observation and assessment on the recruitment of child soldiers.
- Mayyun Organization calls for the issuance of a detailed evaluation report on the extent of the Houthi group's commitment to the action plan to ensure an end to child recruitment and to improve surveillance procedures.

- Mayyun Organization calls pressuring the Houthi group to implement preventive measures stipulated in the action plan, which focuses on demobilizing child soldiers, rehabilitating them, and reintegrating them into society.

Recommendations to the Group of Eminent Experts on Yemen

- Mayyun Organization urges the Group of Eminent Experts on Yemen to include Houthi entities and individuals mentioned in the Under-Secretary-General's annual report on Children in Armed Conflict, on the international sanctions list, due to the effectiveness of this measure in deterring violators of children's rights during armed conflict.
- Mayyun calls on the team to conduct a special investigation into child rights violations in Yemen since the beginning of the war, as they stand in violation of international humanitarian law.

Recommendations to humanitarian organizations working in Yemen, particularly those aiding displaced people

- Mayyun calls for intensive efforts to offer secondary education opportunities to reduce the dropout rates among children, and to adopt child protection programs for boys aged 13 to 18 years old, who are the primary target groups for recruitment.
- Mayyun urges the development of initiatives and projects in conflict areas to alleviate the suffering of Yemeni children and improve their living conditions.
- Mayyun calls for an investigation into the Houthi group's use of humanitarian aid to attract child recruits and referral of those involved for investigation.
